ETC.


MY KIDS LOVED THE AREA & HAD



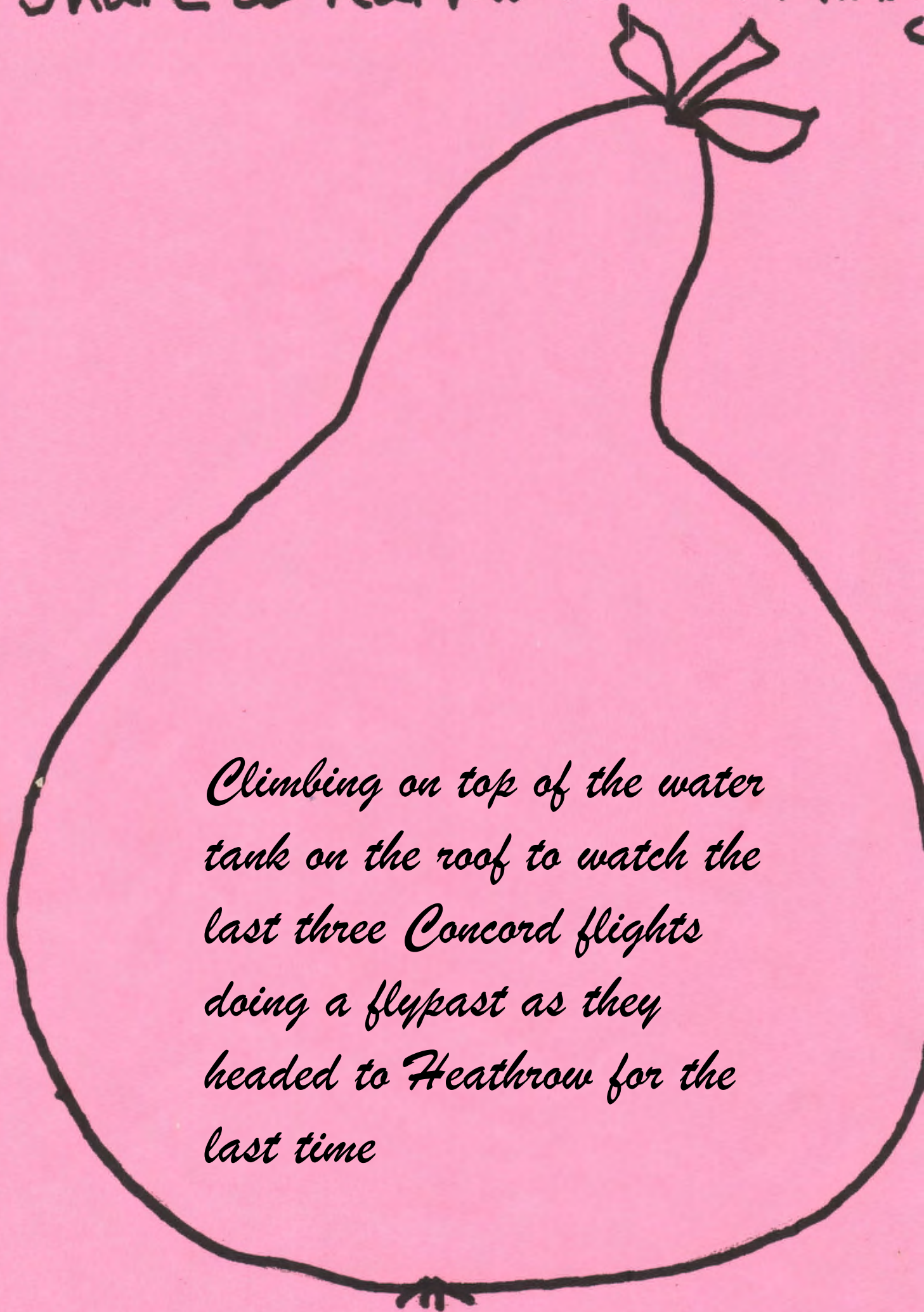
One evening
